Mental Health Needs in People with Developmental Disabilities

Individuals with developmental disabilities experience the full range of psychiatric disorders seen in the general population. However, they often have significant limitations in verbally communicating their coping difficulties to families, support staff, and mental health professionals. As a result, this population is often undiagnosed and untreated for mental health problems. It is essential that those working with individuals with developmental disabilities are able to recognize mental health conditions and arrange for appropriate treatment supports. In this presentation, Dr. Hurley will discuss assessment, symptoms, treatment, and daily support interventions for depression, anxiety, and psychotic disorders in people with developmental disabilities.
